Handbook





Be a Safe Driver

- Defensive driving
- Distracted driving
- Drowsy driving
- Impaired driving





Defensive Driving

 A set of driving skills that allow you to defend against possible collisions.

Tips:

- Look far ahead
- Get the big picture
- Have an escape plan
- Be able to control your speed
- Maintain proper following distance
- Reduce/eliminate driving distractions



Driving in Adverse Conditions

Tips:

- Keep windshield wipers and low beams on
- Do not use cruise control
- Drive, accelerate, decelerate slower than normal
- Additional distance between you & next car
- 100% focus on driving
- Start with full tank of gas & emergency supplies

Advanced Driver Assistance Systems

- Antilock brakes

Advanced Driver Assistance Systems cont.

- Forward collision warning
- Automatic emergency braking
- Side/top view camera
- Tire pressure monitoring
- Drowsiness alert
- Automatic parallel parking



Distracted Driving – MN Cell Phone Laws

Texting and Web Access

 It is illegal for drivers of all ages to compose, read, or send electronic messages or access the Internet on a wireless device when the vehicle is in motion or part of traffic. This includes being stopped in traffic or at a light.

Cell Phone Use and Texting

- Cell phones can be used only by voice command, or singletouch activation without holding the phone.
- It is illegal for drivers under age 18 to use a cell phone, whether hand-held or hands-free — except to call 911 in an emergency.



About Drowsy Driving

- Drowsy-driving crashes
 - The crash risk for driving on 4-5 hours of sleep is 4+ times higher than someone with 7 hours sleep
 - The risk associated with driving on 4-5 hours of sleep is on par with someone with equal to or slightly above the legal limit for alcohol.
 - Most frequently between midnight and 6am, or late afternoon
 - Often involves a single driver
 - Frequently occur on rural roads and highways



Drowsy Driving

- Drowsy-driving Tips
 - Get adequate sleep, especially before long trips
 - Check medications to see if drowsiness is a side effect
 - Avoid peak sleepiness periods if possible.
- Short-term interventions
 - Coffee & energy drinks
 - Naps 20 min.
 - Rumble strips

Impaired Driving - Alcohol & Drugs

 Impaired driving means alcohol or other drugs are affecting a person's ability to safely operate a vehicle.

Impairment begins with the first drink.

The body handles alcohol differently as we age.



Impaired Driving - Prescription and Over-the-Counter Drugs

 Side effects of prescription medicines, over-thecounter medicines, dietary supplements and herbal products may cause car crashes.

 Side effects include: changes in vision, awareness, balance, alertness, reaction time and muscle strength
